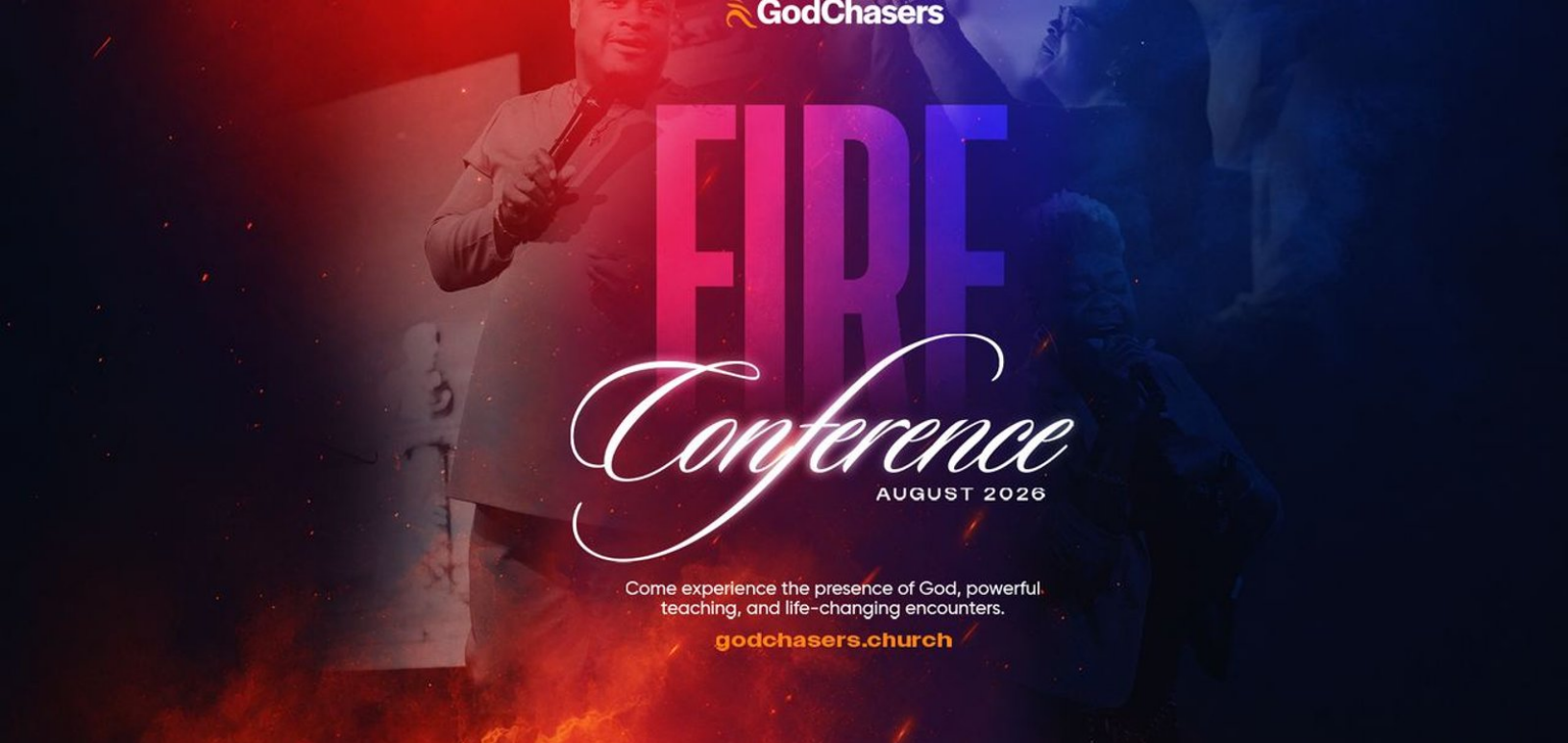

A WORD BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Five August Sundays, guest voices all month, one theme: Holy Spirit renewal, activation, impartation. The first two messages landed on the same nerve - worship that costs nothing changes nothing. This guide covers the conference so far and grows as the fire spreads.

Something Is Missing

If it costs you nothing, check the label

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

"God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth."

- John 4:24, KJV

Read also: Genesis 22:5-7 | John 4:23-24 | Romans 12:1

THE WORD

Micheal Bethany opened the conference with a diagnosis: something is missing. Abraham called a three-day death march up a mountain 'worship' - and most of us call fifteen minutes of singing the same thing. Worship will always challenge you where your values weigh the most. If it's cheap, if it's easy, if it doesn't cost you enough, it probably isn't worship.

You haven't worshiped until you've worshiped in pain. Nobody knows if what you've got is real until your 'yes, Lord' has been tested by a night you didn't choose.

Maybe the songs feel shallow because our value of Him has gotten low. The fix isn't a better setlist. It's a bigger revelation.

"Worship will always challenge you where your values weigh the most. If it doesn't cost you enough, it probably ain't worship."

REFLECT

1. 'If it doesn't cost you enough, it probably ain't worship.' What has worship cost you?
2. Have you ever worshiped in pain? What did it do?
3. If the songs feel shallow, what does that say about our value of Him?

DECLARE THIS ALOUD

My worship costs me something, and I bring it anyway.

I have worshiped in pain, and my yes survived.

My value of God sets the depth of my song.

Something was missing, and I'm bringing it back.

LIVE IT THIS WEEK

Offer God one costly thing this week - the thing that actually feels like sacrifice.

PRAYER

Holy Spirit, raise my value of Jesus until my worship gets expensive again. And when the painful night comes, find my yes still standing. In Jesus' name, Amen.

WEEK 2 | SUNDAY, AUGUST 2

Worship Is Your Sacrifice

Worship is not your song - it's your sacrifice

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

"...present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service."

- Romans 12:1, KJV

Read also: Genesis 22:5-7 | John 4:24 | Romans 12:1

THE WORD

The first time the word worship appears in Scripture, nobody is singing. Abraham is carrying wood and a knife up a mountain with his promise walking beside him. Worship, in its native language, is a costly obedience - the worth-shaped decisions of your daily life.

The ultimate measure of your worship isn't the emotion you feel or the songs you sing, but the weight of your decisions. Living sacrifice is the offering that gets to keep breathing - which means it can also crawl off the altar. Don't.

A revelation of Jesus will determine your worship. If worship has gone flat, it may be because we haven't seen Him lately. Look again.

"Worship is not your song, it's your sacrifice."

REFLECT

1. 'Worship is not your song, it's your sacrifice.' What's the difference in practice?
2. What worth-shaped decision is God asking of you this week?
3. What revelation of Jesus would reignite your worship?

DECLARE THIS ALOUD

My body is a living sacrifice - and it stays on the altar.

My decisions are my loudest worship.

I measure worship in weight, not in volume.

Show me Jesus again, and watch what happens.

LIVE IT THIS WEEK

Make one worth-shaped decision before Sunday and tell your Tribe what it was.

PRAYER

Father, receive the worship that doesn't rhyme - the decisions, the obedience, the weight. I present myself, a living sacrifice. Keep me on the altar. In Jesus' name, Amen.
