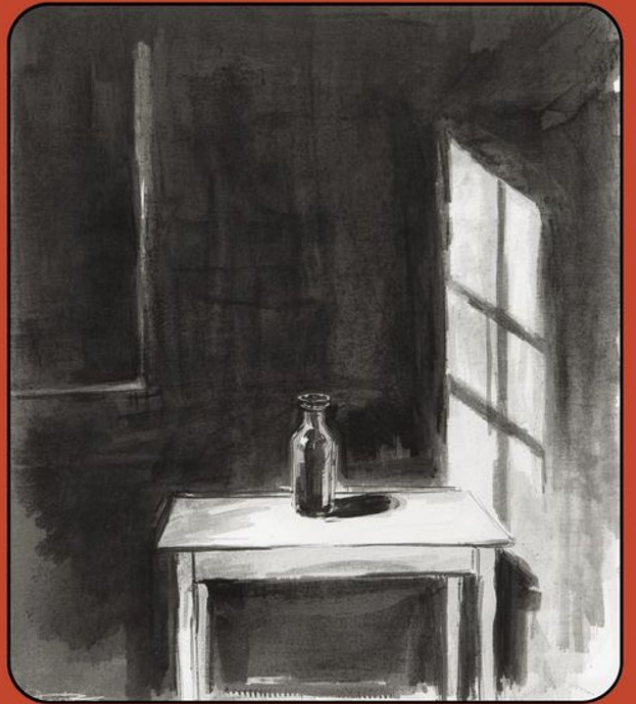

ANCHOR 2 Kings 4:1-7

A WORD BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Two June Sundays about the same discovery: God starts with what's already in your hands. A widow's oil. A widow's flour. Little, poured, multiplied. Heart for the House is not a fundraiser - it's a faith posture.

How to lead this: one message per gathering. Open with the Start Here question - everyone answers, no wrong answers. Read the scripture together. Read The Word aloud, or in turns. Let the questions do the work. Declare together, take the Go Do It seriously, and land the night on the prayer. Your job isn't to have the answers - it's to keep the circle honest and finish on time.

What Do You Have in Your House? (2 Kings 4:1-7)

God multiplies what you pour, not what you protect

START HERE

What's the most useful thing in your junk drawer?

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

"Tell me, what hast thou in the house?"

- 2 Kings 4:2, KJV

Read also: 2 Kings 4:1-7 | Psalm 37:25

THE WORD

A widow in debt, sons about to be taken, and a prophet asks the strangest question: what do you have in the house? Her answer - nothing, except a pot of oil. Except. The whole miracle lived inside the word she almost skipped.

Don't despise the little oil. God's pattern is consistent: He doesn't start with what you lack; He starts with what you're holding and hoping is enough. Your assignment is to pour. His job is to make not enough into more than enough.

"What do you have in your house?"

TALK ABOUT IT

1. What's the 'little oil' already in your house that you've been despising?
2. What does it mean that your job is to pour and God's job is to multiply?
3. Where is God asking you to pour right now?

DECLARE TOGETHER

I will not despise the little in my hands.

My job is to pour; God's job is to multiply.

My 'except' is the address of my miracle.

There is more in my house than I've been counting.

GO DO IT

List what's already in your house - gifts, skills, resources - and pour one out this week.

PRAY TOGETHER

Father, open my eyes to the oil I've been calling nothing. I'm bringing my vessels - all of them - and I'm going to pour. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Bake Another Cake - Part 1

Put God first when the pantry is lowest

START HERE

What's your go-to recipe when there's almost nothing in the pantry?

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

"...make me thereof a little cake first..."

- 1 Kings 17:13, KJV

Read also: 1 Kings 17:8-16 | Proverbs 3:5-6 | Zechariah 4:10

THE WORD

Elijah met a widow gathering sticks for a last meal, and asked for the first bite of it. It sounds cruel until you see what it was: an invitation to put God first at the exact moment the math said she couldn't afford to. The flour didn't fail, and the oil didn't run dry - because God starts where you end.

You never know the goodness of God until you pour out of yourself. It's not what you have - it's whose hands it's in. If you put God last, He can never fit in your situation; last place is too small for Him.

TALK ABOUT IT

1. The widow baked God's cake first. What does 'God first' cost you?
2. Where has God multiplied something small you almost held back?
3. What are you trusting God to revive that looks dead?

DECLARE TOGETHER

God gets my first, not my leftovers.

It's not what I have - it's whose hands it's in.

God starts where I end, so I'm not afraid of the bottom.

My barrel obeys the promise, not the math.

GO DO IT

Put God first in your finances this week, before the math tells you it's safe.

PRAY TOGETHER

Lord, I've done the math and the math says hold back. But You say first. So here's my little cake, and here's my trust. In Jesus' name, Amen.
